Arlington Beach Camp and Conference Centre was started in 1960 with a vision of reaching out to children and adults with the Gospel of Christ. It was to be a place where people could come and meet with Jesus, be challenged in their faith, and find renewal and restoration. Situated on 140 acres of land in south-central Saskatchewan along the eastern shore of Last Mountain Lake, we have worked hard to create a place where families, friends, and church communities can strengthen and build up their relationships with one another and with God, and we know that God has used us to make a difference in the lives of His children.

Each summer, Arlington Beach Camp hosts children from 5 – 15 years old at camps designed specifically to encourage their personal, emotional, mental, and spiritual growth. While at camp, our kids enjoy water activities such as canoeing, kayaking, paddleboards, tubing, skiing, and kneeboarding, along with jumping on our water trampoline and diving off our massive floating dock. We also offer kids the opportunity to express their adventurous spirit on our climbing wall and zip line, bouldering wall, and our brand new high ropes course. We also have two pump tracks for cyclist of every skill level to enjoy, and activities such as archery, painting, crafts, dance and drama are offered for the less adventurously inclined.



Perhaps most importantly, we provide our campers with the opportunity to meet Jesus, and to get to know Him better every day. Our chapel times include enthusiastic singing, excellent speakers, and laugh-out-loud experiences, all focussed on helping our kids understand the love of God better. Our staff spend time in the Word with our campers, giving them real life discipleship and a chance to respond more personally to the things they have been learning about themselves and God. We are blessed to have the opportunity to see lives changed at camp every year, and it is why we keep doing what we do each summer.



No summer at a Free Methodist camp would be complete without Family Camp, where hundreds of people from all over western Canada (and as far away as southern California) gather to renew old friendships, make new acquaintances, and experience the peace and love of God in a way you can only find at camp. Family Camp is 8 days of fun, fellowship, relaxation, and hearing about the love of God from some of the best speakers we can find.

Lest you get the wrong idea, Arlington Beach is so much more than just summer camp. Arlington Beach is also an organised Hamlet in the province of Saskatchewan. Several of our 60 cabin owners live at Arlington year round, and spend a lot of time volunteering and encouraging our ministry. Our recently renovated lodge is a beautiful four season retreat than can sleep up to 84 people. We have rental groups that range from schools and businesses to churches and interdenominational ministries. We have the privilege of hosting family reunions, weddings, retreats, network meetings, and Regional Gathering. We have also partnered with several non-church organisations such as the Saskatchewan Brain Injury Association and the Acquired Brain Injury association to provide a facility for their annual retreats, and we are the host camp for Camp Circle of Friends, which is a camp for kids whose lives have been impacted by cancer. In short, we are doing everything we can to be a light shining on the hill in a dark world.



Arlington Beach is continually seeking to improve our ability to meet the needs of our campers, retreaters, and rental groups. We have just launched a capital campaign focussed on increasing our capacity and enhancing our infrastructure which will lay the groundwork for future expansion and continued improvement in our programs. Our mission is to provide experiences and environments where people of all ages can meet with Christ, and all of our efforts are focussed on eliminating the distractions and excuses that get in the way of that mission.

We believe that God uses camps like ours to make a profound difference in the lives of His children. In short, camp changes lives, and we are honoured and privileged to be a part of that mission.
